CANDIDATES

Individuals intending to seek election to the Board of Directors must be a current member of the International Association of Arson Investigators and have been a member for at least two years. Individuals must provide a valid membership card.

INSTRUCTOR BIOGRAPHIES

Smokey Dyer – Chief Smokey Dyer is a forty plus year veteran of the fire service. He is the current chief of the Kansas City, Missouri Fire Department (KCFD). Chief Dyer first began investigating fires in 1973 and has testified in numerous fire cases as an expert witness in state and federal courts. In 1999 he became a principle member of the NFPA 921 Committee involving fire and explosion investigations.

Doug Monty – Doug is a graduate of The University of Oklahoma. He has been an ATF Special Agent for over 21 years and an ATF CFI for about 12 years and is currently assigned to the Wichita Field Office of the Kansas City Field Division. Doug is also an IAAI CFI. He has taught at other IAAI seminars, Wichita State University, Butler County Community College, the IAAI 80 hour class, and the ATF National Academy.

Ray Marbut - Ray Marbut has been a member of the Augusta Department of Public Safety since 1976 and is the Commander of the Fire Division. He is a graduate of the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Academy in 1979 and has attended and instructed numerous classes in the field of fire investigation. Ray has provided expert testimony in both criminal and civil courts and has participated in four murder/arson investigations with successful conclusion to three of these cases. The fourth case the body of the victim was never recovered.

Rebecca Vincent-Giles is a deputy sheriff for the Johnson County Sheriff's Office and currently works as a Crime Scene Investigator at the Johnson County Criminalistics Laboratory. Rebecca has been a crime scene investigator for four years and is a Certified Crime Scene Investigator. She is a member of the American Academy of Forensic Science, the International Association for Identification (IAI), the Kansas Division of the IAI, the Midwestern Association of Forensic Science and the International Association of Bloodstain Pattern Analysts.

Brian Sprinkle has been a local law enforcement officer since 1995. He spent ten years as a criminal investigator and was assigned to the Pennsylvania State Police Computer Crime Task Force in 2003. Brian has investigated and successfully prosecuted crimes ranging from identity theft to child pornography to criminal homicide. As a computer forensic examiner, Brian assists members of his agency, as well as officers from other local, state and federal agencies, with computer related crimes, as well as performing pro-active investigations into child luring and the sharing of child pornography over the internet. Brian has testified in state and federal proceedings, and has received training in computer crime and computer forensics from numerous state, local and federal agencies and organizations. Additionally, due to his training and experience, Brian has been a court accepted expert witness in the area of Computer Forensics.

Ryan M. Rezzelle is the Supervisor of the Crime Scene Investigation Section for the Johnson County (KS) Sheriff's Office Criminalistics Laboratory, where he has worked since September 2008. Ryan previously worked for eight years as a Crime Scene Investigator for the Kansas City (MO) Police Department, with his last two years in a supervisory capacity. He is a Certified Senior Crime Scene Analyst and he is a member of the American Academy of Forensic Science, the International Association for Identification, the Midwestern Association of Forensic Science and the International Association of Bloodstain Pattern Analysts.
